From the Commodore

Hello fellow MBYC members,

Hope this newsletter finds everyone well and enjoying this break from the summer heat we have had so far. Winds are light, temperatures are cool, great weather for the Power Boaters to use their boats in the mild conditions.

Unfortunately, we recently had a boat fire, this one on A dock, that destroyed the boat, and damaged the boats on both sides of it. The root cause was traced to electrical system overload. We have had a number of electrical cord incidents and now at least two boat fires that were caused by electrical issues. To help prevent this we are asking everyone to visually inspect their shore power cords for physical wear, for signs of heat damage at both the pedestal connections and the inlet connections on their boats. These connections should be checked both outside of the boat and on the wires connected to the inside of the boat power connection. Always be sure that circuits are not overloaded and be sure that any drop cords are rated for the load they are being used for. Boat power systems are not capable of the type of loads that are our houses can provide. Boat materials are extremely flammable which results in any fire spreading rapidly throughout the vessel and can easily spread to adjacent vessels.

Fortunately, there were no serious injuries from this fire. Thanks to the Local Fire Department for their rapid response limiting the damage to just those 3 boats.

Please make sure your service contractor's have their insurance on file with our office, and they keep the dock's clear of cart's and free of clutter.



HURICANE PREPARATION PLAN

1. Dock boxes secured with locks, zip ties or rope.
2. Docks are clear of all lightweight or loose items.
3. Boat owners need to secure loose or lightweight items to prevent flying objects.
4. All boat dock lines need to be checked for proper knots, chafing, size, quantity, etc..
5. Double dock lines are highly suggested.

Continue to monitor NOAA thru the event. The MBYC staff will be walking docks a head of the storm and advise owner's of any issues. Office may close as needed due to weather event.
